His expertise is structural design, adaptive reuse, seismic evaluation/retrofit, and historic preservation for projects including historic landmarks, laboratories, commercial building repair/retrofit, studio production facility design, building evaluations, and educational facilities.

David's activity in historic preservation includes presentations regarding adaptive reuse. He leads many professional organizations, preservation groups, and structural and earthquake engineering associations. As a recognized expert in post-disaster business resiliency and continuity, he believes preplanning and city partnerships greatly reduce business interruption post-disaster.
